

Silent Night in Bethlehem: Jesus's Birthplace Under Israeli Annexation Policies

Israel's "annexation by stealth" has transformed Bethlehem into a model of gradual, illegal incorporation of occupied Palestinian land. Through settlement expansion, land confiscation, forced displacement, and demographic engineering, Israel is entrenching permanent control while erasing its last remaining Palestinian Christian population.

Palestinian Christians stand at less than 1% in the oPt and are on a severe decline since 7 Oct, 2023, due to Israel's occupation, coercive environment, and dedevelopment policies.

For example: unemployment rate in Bethlehem stands at 31%; \$2.5 million/day lost in tourism (June 2025).

85% of Bethlehem

167,000 dunums (≈25%) of Bethlehem's land annexed by military orders (July 2025).

25,000 dunums declared "state land" in 2024-25 using Ottoman-era laws.

Attacks documented in <u>10+</u> locales (Al-Makhrour, Tuqu', Al-Khader, etc.).

<u>150,000</u> firearms distributed to settlers since Oct 2023.

800 new militias formed in the West Bank post-October 2023.



Khallet an-Nu'man village is slated for total demolition.

Refugee camps (Dheisheh, Aida, Azza) face regular raids, demolitions, and arrests.

New Settlements in Beit Sahour, "Shidma" functions as a connective node between settlements in the Gush Etzion bloc.

New settlements, such as Nahal Heletz, threaten UNESCO sites, including **Battir and Al-Makhrour**.

The settler population in the West Bank grew from <u>115,700</u> (1993) to <u>750,000</u> (2025).

139 new settler roads (116 km) built since mid-2023, mostly through Palestinian land.
